These issues alone would suggest that our budgeted loss for 2012 of \$79k may expand beyond our expectations.

The departure of our Accounting Manager in November, on short notice, threw our last quarter accounting into some disarray. The result was that the year end audit became very difficult and we are indebted to David Duff and his staff at Gillespies for the capability and application that they exhibited in completing the task. The auditors identified additional year end accounting adjustments which extended our loss for the year by an additional \$36k to ap-

proximately \$86K (I am still awaiting a final figure).
